2 Madisonians drown near Eau Claire

The bodies of two Madison men who drowned Saturday while fishing in the Eau Claire river were identified Sunday by Eau Chaire County Sheriff's authorities.

They are Thomas G. Disrud, 22, of 6 Colin Court, and Paul F. den Dans, 22, of 5310 Barton Road,

The two were fishing with a third Madleon man, Jeffrey A. Nelson, 28, of 616 Bordner Drive at the Altoona dam, two miles east of Eku Claire, at

about 3:30 p.m. tors at the University of Wisconstn Icau Claire and were graduates of Madison Memorial, High School. Disrud is the son the Gerald and Connie Discud, Madison, and den Daas is the son of Mr and Mrs. Hans G. den Dans, also of Madison.

Nelson, also a student at UW-Eau Claire, is the son of Gaylord Nelson, former Wisconsin governor and former U.S. senator.

According to Eau Claire County Sgt. Terry Biddle, Disrud and den Daas were fishing with waders below the gates of the dam when Disrud either fell or stepped over a drop off while trying to untangle his fishing line.

Den Dans then tried to rescue Dis rud, stepped over the drop-off and went under. Nelson, fishing on the south shore below the dam, ran to a phone and called authorities.

The two bodies were recovered below the dam, Disrud's at 5:30 p.m. Saturday and den Daas's at 12 30 p.m. Sunday.

Five law and emergency agencies assisted in the search, as well as members of the Blue Waters diving group, a private scuba diving club in Eau Claire

Funeral services for Disrud will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Maria Goretti Catholic Church, 5405 Flad Ave. Friends may call after 4 p.m. today at the Joyce Funeral Home, 5701 Odana Road, where a prayer service will be held at 7 30 p.m.
